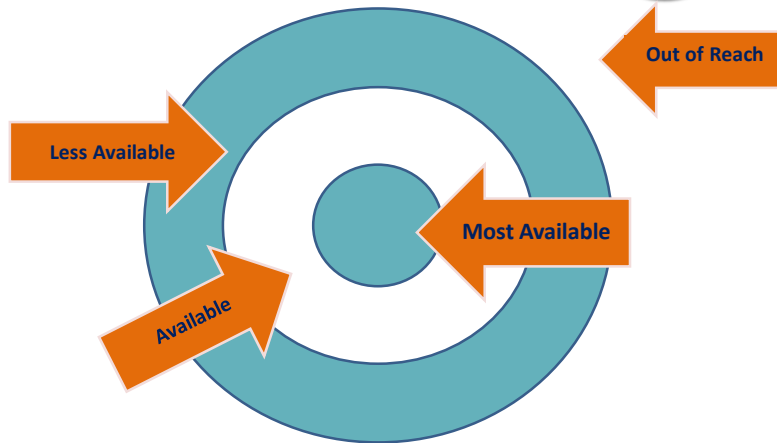

Lexical Substitution

- Replacing a word or lexical item with another word or lexical item without changing the meaning of the message.
- **General to Specific**
 - Furniture
 - Sofa
 - Loveseat
- Primary and Secondary meaning
- Compounds – blackboard
- Collocations – wasting time
- Jargon

A man has a can and an opener.

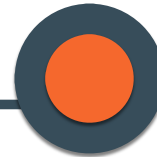
He uses the can opener to begin taking the lid off the can.

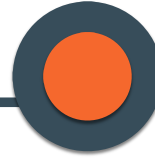
